Lucky Word Origins



Luck is Middle Dutch in origin, coming from *luc*, a shortening of *gheluc*, “happiness, good fortune.”

Potluck now mostly associated with “a meal consisting of whatever guests have brought,” originally meant “what may chance to be in the pot, in provision for a meal; hence, a meal at which no special preparation has been made for guests.”

Hap is older than luck. Originating in the 12th century, the word comes from the Old Norse *happ*, meaning “chance, good luck.” Hap gives us happy, as well as haphazard, “chance; accidental; random”; hapless, “luckless, unfortunate”; and mishap, “misfortune.”

A **lucky-penny** is “a small sum given back ‘for luck’ to the purchaser or payer by the person who receives money in a bargain or other transaction,” as well



as “a copper tossed overboard ‘for luck.’”

A **Lucky-bag** is “a receptacle on a man-of-war for all clothes and other articles of private property carelessly left by their owners,” so-called because these articles “were later auctioned off,” says *A Sailor’s History of the U.S. Navy*, “thereby making those Sailors fortunate enough to obtain new items for relatively little money ‘lucky.’” Another definition of lucky-bag is similar to that of grab bag or goody bag.

Mascot — and this seems particularly appropriate during the NCAA Tournament — you could get your own mascot, “a thing supposed to bring good luck to its possessor; a person whose presence is supposed to be a cause of good fortune.” The word mascot comes from the French *mascotte*, “sorcerer’s charm,” which ultimately comes from the Medieval Latin.



Luck of the Irish

The phrase *luck of the Irish* is commonly thought to mean “extreme good fortune.” However, the term has not an Irish origin but “a happier, if not altogether positive,” American one. “During the gold and silver rush years in the second half of the 19th century, a number of the most famous and successful miners were of Irish and Irish American birth. . . . Over time this association of the Irish with mining fortunes led to the expression ‘luck of the Irish.’ Of course, it carried with it a certain tone of derision, as if to say, only by sheer luck, as opposed to brains, could these fools succeed.”

Four – The traditional Ukrainian Easter egg is called a *pysanka*. It's made by writing on an egg with a stylus dipped in hot beeswax, dipping the waxed egg in dye, then repeating the process to create complex and beautiful designs.

Although modern *pysanky* are decorated with patterns that commemorate Christ's resurrection, the practice dates back to the pre-Christian era, with symbols and patterns that originally represented spring festivals, rebirth, and the sun god Dazhboh.

Five – The word "Easter" is presumed to derive from the name "Eostre", a goddess who symbolizes the hare and the egg, based on the writings of an 8th century English monk.

Six – In 1878, President Rutherford B. Hayes held the first Easter Egg Roll at the White House - a race where children push decorated hard-boiled eggs across the White House lawn. The 140th Easter Egg Roll will be held on April 2 this year.

One – The tallest chocolate Easter egg was made in Italy in 2011. It was 34 feet tall and weighed 15,873 pounds. That's taller than the world's largest animal, the giraffe, which can grow up to 18 feet!

Two – Easter bunnies came to the US during the 18th century, originating in Europe as the Easter Hare.

Three – The Easter flower is a white lily. It represents love and

Seven – Americans consume over 16 million jelly beans on Easter, which, when lined up, would go around the globe at least three times. It is believed the first affiliation of jelly beans with Easter happened in the 1930s, because of their egg-like shape.


